Educational Timeline

- School year: August-June; Graduation occurs in June OR January-November; Graduation occurs in November
- Primary Years Programme for students aged 3 to 12, Middle Years Programme for students aged 11 to 16, Diploma Programme for students aged 16 to 19, and the Career-related Certificate for students aged 16 to 19.
- Exams for the Diploma Programme are offered in May and November which would be the dates of graduation. The diploma is awarded to students who gain at least 24 points.

Group A: Documents That Meet High School Graduation Requirement

Students presenting documents other than those listed below will be evaluated on a case-by-case basis

-International Baccalaureate Diploma, accompanying certificate, and yearly grade reports from secondary school

Group B: Documents That Do Not Meet High School Graduation Requirement

Comparable to less than completion of US high school

Individual Subject Certificates without Diploma

GPA Calculation

Calculate the cumulative high school GPA by converting line-by-line all grades listed on the exam results certificate and accompanying high school transcript to US equivalents and convert to quality points. Divide quality points by the total number of courses attempted.

Class Ranking

Class rank is evaluated based on a letter written and submitted by the headmaster or principal of the institution from which the student graduated. The letter must confirm both the student's final position in his/her secondary school class and the total number of students in the graduating class (e.g. the student is 41st in a total graduating class of 112 students).

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
